Are we sure that poster presentation is less important and prestigious compared to oral presentation? We completely agree with the authors that "there is a lot to be gained from a poster session". The authors provide helpful tips for preparing a poster seriously and with rigor. A well-prepared poster and a brief oral summary of its content {1} are crucial for the presenter to actively engage in scientific discussions. Young researchers should remember that a poster session may be a great opportunity for meeting expert scientists in a friendly and relaxed atmosphere and for receiving important advice for their studies. They also should remember, as the authors remark, that if a (well prepared) poster gets few visitors or receives a lot of criticism, it does not mean that the content is not of value. This work is an important one-page message for graduate students, post-docs and young scientists.
